NOTE: The infomation for 1989 is very incomplete due to a general lack of statistical data on each denomination listed in the 1989 Lausanne Puerto Rico Country Committee report. The total number of local churches in our online Protestant church database for Puerto Rico is 3,904 plus 294 additional churches that were not included online because they lack physical or mailing addresses, which gives a total of 4,198 in our current PR database.

- (1) "Puerto Rico: A People Prepared," produced by the Lausanne Puerto Rico Country Committee, Country Portrait Series, Lausanne II Congress on World Evangelization, July 11-20, 1989, in Manila, The Philippines (no statistics were given for official membership and only partial statistics were given for "community."). PROLADES believes that the information provided in this report was overly optimistic.
- (2) PROLADES research on Puerto Rico, which identified additional Protestant denominations at work there in 1989 that were not listed in the Lausanne Puerto Rico Country Committee report.
- (3) PROLADES research on Puerto Rico during 2011-2012, which identified additional Protestant denominations at work there that were not listed in the 1989 Lausanne Puerto Rico Country Committee report. The current PROLADES database includes 4,198 local churches, but there are probably many more churches that we have not discovered yet. Our research was done by mining the Internet and published sources of information; we had neither time or funds to conduct fieldwork in Puerto Rico. Therefore, this report should be considered a research-in-progress report and an encouragement to other researchers to conduct their own fieldwork in Puerto Rico in order to discover the current status of the Protestant movement in this nation.
- (4) This preliminary report on the Protestant movement in Puerto Rico reveals that many of the denominations listed in the 1989 Lausanne Puerto Rico Country Committee report had experienced an increase in the number of affiliated churches by July 2012, assuming that the figures reported in 1989 were accurate. However, we believe that the estimate of 1,280 independent Pentecostal churches in 1989 was an inaccurate one, which inflated the total number of Protestant churches reported in Puerto Rico for that date. Additional research needs to be done to determine if those denominations above that seem to have fewer local churches today than in 1989 have actually declined during 1989-2012 or if they actually have more churches that we have discovered so far in our preliminary research. The current total number of local churches in our Puerto Rican database (4,198) is 734 less than the number listed for 1989 (4,932), according to the Lausanne Puerto Rico Country Committee report.
- (5) Therefore, we have estimated that for 15 July 2012 there were probably about 5,000 local Protestant churches in Puerto Rico, with an average church size of about 100 members (adult baptized believers); if the Total Protestant Community is twice the average church size, then multiplying the number of local churches (5,000) times 200% gives us a total of about 1,000,000 Protestants in Puerto Rico, or about 29-30% of the national population in mid-2012.
